How the Indianapolis Foundation is Building the Case for the Best Way to End Homelessness

OVERVIEW

The Indianapolis Foundation is leading a systems-level shift in how their city addresses homelessness. Their thesis? That permanent housing with direct supportive service – all backed by a unified vision, focused data, shared knowledge, and human stories that drive action, will unlock long-term impact.

With Metaimpact as their multi-stakeholder operating system, they've built the clarity, credibility, and collaborative infrastructure to turn that bet into a movement—starting with an initiative called Housing to Recovery, and now scaling across their broader equity strategy.

THE CHALLENGE

When the Vision is Bold, but the System is Broken

The Indianapolis Foundation is a civic backbone organization advancing equity across four key pillars: housing, economic opportunity, environment, and health equity.

Their journey with Metaimpact began within the Housing Equity pillar, through a catalytic initiative called **Housing to Recovery**—a collaborative effort to track not just housing placements, but provide a model and resources for the wraparound services required for individuals and families to stay housed. For over two years, the Indianapolis Foundation used Metaimpact to manage Housing to Recovery reporting and storytelling, enabling:

Transparent tracking of housing placements and stability

Visibility into mental health, medical services, and case management

A single source of truth for funding and outcomes, giving partners and supporters visibility into where dollars flowed—and the impact they created.

The success of this early partnership didn't just improve a single initiative. It laid the groundwork for something bigger: a shared platform to manage and advance all four equity pillars. **But executing that broader vision came with familiar roadblocks:**

Critical data scattered across city systems, partners and service providers, and grantee organizations

A complex web of stakeholders without a shared space to align

Stories funders believed in—but couldn't clearly see

And with major efforts on the horizon like Streets to Home Indy—an initiative to eliminate chronic homelessness in the city—they couldn't afford to stay siloed. **To move forward, they needed to bring it all together:**



Housing Inventory



Subsidy/Rental Assistance Supply



Service Provider Networks

And most importantly, a shared story for funders, the board, the public—and ultimately, other communities addressing this in a similar fashion across the country.

THE SOLUTION

The Operating System for Shared Progress

Metainpact became the central hub to align, act, and demonstrate progress—not just for Housing to Recovery, but for a growing set of citywide initiatives. **Together, we:**



Unified fragmented data

from four different systems into a centralized view of Indianapolis' supportive housing inventory—something that had never existed before, and now on track to represent the full landscape.



Activated shared workspaces

that brought the Indianapolis Foundation, CHIP (Coalition for Homelessness Intervention and Prevention), the City of Indianapolis, and over 15 service providers into one coordinated environment to align goals, share insights, and coordinate action across the entire ecosystem.



Used Metainpact's narrative tools

to create compelling stories that combine data and lived experience—powering reports for funders, civic leaders, and internal teams alike.



Began building a next-generation permanent supportive housing management system

where organizations will soon report unit availability and service readiness—all within one shared platform.

What started as a project-level use case has now evolved into a long-term strategy—one that replaces reactive reporting with real-time visibility and shared accountability.



THE OUTCOME

From Fragmented Effort to Collective Momentum

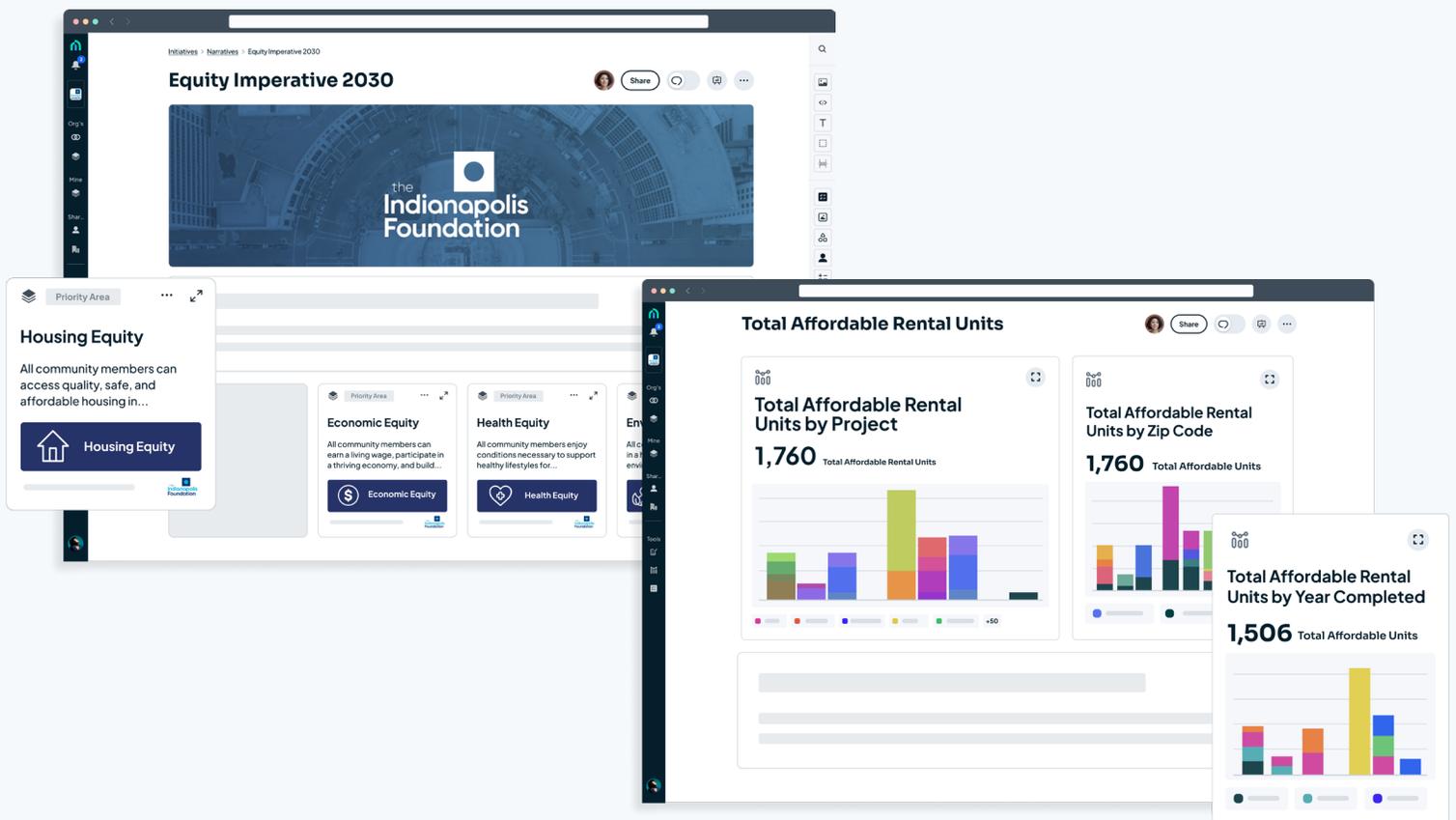
The Indianapolis Foundation isn't just running a program. They're shaping a policy narrative.

A unified housing inventory is now providing unprecedented visibility into the city's permanent supportive housing landscape — with a clear line of sight toward representing nearly 100% of all available units.

A credible narrative now exists, grounded in shared data, not speculation—ready to inform decisions from the city to the statehouse.





The Bottom Line

The Indianapolis Foundation is working to influence a systems-wide shift—where permanent supportive housing becomes policy and has dedicated funding due to its proven outcomes, not just preference or once thought to be a good idea.

And with Metaimpact, they're not just advocating for change—they're equipping their partners, their funders, and others communities across the country with the evidence to make it real.
